# The Champions

The winners of category I, II and III would be declared based on the score of the National Final Championship.

Participants of category IV, V and VI will participate in a project presentation round before the declaration of the final results. The marks for this round will be based on

The content matter of the presentation

The participation in the Q & A session following the project presentation. (own & others)

Top Ten students from each category would be selected based on the score of National Orals to participate in the final project presentation round. Every participant will have to present a project based on the application of mathematics. The topic for the presentation would be specified along with the declaration of results of the National Prelims. The time frame for the project presentation per participant is ten minutes.

Winners of category IV, V and VI would be declared based on the cumulative score of all the rounds of the National Championship and also the project presentation.



Express Math is designed to test the latent mathematical talent of the student to help in assessing their skills beyond the scope of normative grading.

## The competition

The first level of Xpress Math will be conducted at the school level. The school championship comprises of written rounds only.

The written round will contain 120 objective type questions with four options each. The task is to answer maximum number of questions correctly in 60 minutes.

## The marking scheme

4 marks will be given for every correct answer
1 mark will be deducted for every wrong answer

### The Qualifiers

Based on the written round marks, the toppers in every category from each participating school will qualify for the National Preliminary oral round.

## The National Preliminary Round

This is a combination of written and oral rounds. Every student will have to answer maximum number of questions within the specified time frame.

## The marking scheme

The participant will be awarded 8 marks for every correct answer.

2 marks will be deducted for each wrong answer from the total.

### The Qualifiers

The qualifiers for the national final round is selected on the basis of the cumulative marks of the written and oral rounds of the National Prelims.

### The National finals

Toppers in each category from every location will be selected to participate in the National Finals.

## The marking scheme

Every correct answer would win the participant 20 marks

For each wrong answer, the participant will loose 5 marks.
